## A growing network of bilingual private nurseries (< 3 years old)

 REGIONBilingual nurseries in Paris Region are private daycare centers in which spots must be booked by companies for their employees, near their homes or work

## - Benefits for companies and employees

Creating a better work-life balance
Building royalty among employees

## - Attractive pricing for companies

Spots are co-financed by parents, the CAF (French family benefit fund) and companies Companies can deduct 83\% of the costs incurred (family tax credit, corporate tax savings) Net cost for the employer: from $€ 150$ to $€ 255 /$ month/spot for a full-time daycare spot

## The Paris Region international schooling offer

Paris Region has an affordable selection of bilingual programs and international schools open to foreign and French pupils from kindergarden to high school:

## The French school system, either taught in French or through international programs

For bilingual or non-French speaking young children, those parents are planning a long stay in France, wishing to become fluent in French and accustomed to French culture

- Operated by the French Public Education Authority, public schools are free of charge
- Some International Sections are free, for others, fees are between 0 and $€ 6,000$ / year, depending on school levels

The international schools, which enable students to follow the curriculum of another country

Good alternatives for the expatriates who are only here for a few years so that their children will easily reintegrate a school back home when they return

- Wide range of private schools including bilingual / international / foreign schools
- Variety of curriculum: IB, European Baccalaureate, A-Levels, High School Diploma, Montessori...
- Fees from $€ 5,000$ to $€ 40,000$ / year, depending on grade levels

## Zoom on French schools with International Sections (state-subsidized)

French schools with International Sections follow the national French curriculum and offer an International Section where foreign languages are taught and where some courses such as history, geography, literature are taught in a language other than French

- From kindergarden (3-6 yo) to high school (15-18 yo)
- Intensive schooling with a weekly basis of 6 to 10 class hours taught in the language of the section
- Intensive French language instruction over the course of the year for pupils who do not speak French upon admission
- Diplomas: International French Baccalaureate
- Fees are modest ( $0-€ 6,000 /$ year)
- 90 French schools offering International Sections in 17 different languages

## A European School in Paris-La Défense

- Plurilingual and multicultural European education, from kindergarden level (4 yo) to university entrance
- Two linguistic sections: French and English
- 280 students in 2022, gradual development up to 1,000 students in 2028
- Free of charge and priority admission for children of European / international institutions and organisations staff

- Diploma: The European Baccalaureate diploma, recognized as an entry qualification for Higher Education in all the countries of the European Union, as well as in several others
- Easily accessible from the Paris' centre (20 to 30 min by public transport)

## Zoom on international and private schools (not state-subsidized or state-contracted)

Private schools are non-French unilingual schools teaching a national curriculum or bilingual/international schools following the French curriculum or be a mixture of several international curricula, offering instruction in both French as well as other languages

- Private schools may be "sous contrat" (state-contracted private school, the school must follow the French national curriculum) or "hors contrat" (independent school, not state-subsidized)
- From kindergarden to high school
- Diplomas: International Baccalaureate IB, national diplomas (High School Diploma, A-Levels,...)
- Curriculum: International curriculum, Montessori, national curricula (American, British, German,...)
- Fees from $€ 8,000$ to $€ 35,000$ /year for not state-subsidized school
- Most schools offer rolling admissions all year long and still have capacity to accommodate new students

## Annex - School grade equivalents

## In France, compulsory schooling starts at 3 years old

Some private nursery schools accept children from 2 years of age:
To be accepted, children must be 2 yo at the start of school in September (some schools require that children be pottytrained), and when there are more children than places older children are given preference.

Pupils are admitted to the nursery school at the beginning of the school year in September of the calendar year in which the child reaches four years of age.

## Several types of childcare exist in France for children between 3 months and 3 years old <br> *Options offering English-speaking or bilingual childcare

## Crèches

or daycare centers with qualified professionals and equipped sites

## Collective crèches

Run by the local authority (town hall) or a private association.
How to register?
At the town hall with a proof of address.
The allocation commissions are held 3 or 4 times a
year as of May.
Places are limited and waiting lists may be long!

## Parental crèches

Run by the parents' association. Parents participate in the educational development. Few places only!
Where to look?
On your town hall's website (section Petite Enfance)

## Micro-crèches

Private and smaller crèches that usually accommodate up to 10 children.

## Halte-garderies

Drop-in daycare services for children from 2.5 months up to 6 years old on a part-time or occasional basis.

## Enterprise crèches*

Private daycare centers in which spots must be booked directly by companies for their employees, near their homes or work. Spots are co-financed by parents, the CAF (French family benefit fund) and companies. Companies can deduct $83 \%$ of the costs incurred. The remaining cost for the employee is usually the same as in a collective crèche.

Most bilingual (French/English) crèches in Paris Region (People\&Baby, Little Frogs, Crèches Plumes, les Petites Canailles...) are enterprise crèches!

## Childminders

## Certified childminders

Childminders (or Assistant(e) maternel(le)) have certifications allowing them to supervise children ( 1 to 4) in their own homes.
Where to look?
Contact your town hall to get a list of registered childminders. It is necessary to call them and arrange to meet.

## Home-based childminders or nannies*

To hire nannies who look after children in your own home (garde à domicile) or to opt for sharing childcare with another family (garde partagée).

## Childminders agencies*

Families use these agencies either to find the childminder only, or also to be the employer of the childminder and manage the administrative formalities.

# If my child does not speak French, can he/she be enrolled in a French school? What help can be provided? What are the best options? 

In France, all children aged 3 to 16 are guaranteed instruction once they are in the country, regardless of their nationality and whatever their mastery of the French language.
Thus, the French national education system guarantees newly arrived pupils who do not speak French access to French education and special teaching units are offering dedicated learning support in French language for the newcomers.
Private schools may not propose such a support service.
Some International Sections could enroll pupils who do not speak French upon admission. These pupils could receive intensive French language instruction over the course of one year and then join regular French classes in their second year.

## International <br> Schooling

## If my child does not speak French, can he/she be enrolled in a French school? What help can be provided? What are the best options?

If a pupil is about to complete his/her secondary school studies, the choice made by the family regarding the type of school will play a key role:
$\checkmark$ If the pupil is enrolled in a state school or in a state-funded school, the student will need the appropriate academic background to take the baccalaureate exam, and in particular an adequate level in French. A teaching support might be given with intensive courses in French.
$\checkmark$ If the pupil is enrolled in a non-contracted private school, he might prepare for a diploma and sit tests or exams (A-level, IB...) that will not necessarily require the same prerequisites in particular as regards the level in French.

## Tuition fees

## What might be the estimated budget of school tuition fees?

The cost might vary greatly depending on the type of school chosen by the family.
State-schools are free of charge, families only contribute to the cost of school meals and extra-curricular activities.

Some International Sections are free, and other that are hosted in French state schools are run by parents' associations and are partially fee-paying programs. In general, the fees are range from $€ 0$ to $€ 6,000$ per year, depending on grade levels.

Regarding private schools, families are advised to check school fees and tuition with the schools they are interested in. The fees can range from $€ 5,000$ to $€ 40,000$ per year, depending on grade levels.
Not to mention non-refundable application fees and capital assessment fees that means the one-off payment for new pupils, or extra-curricular activities.

## How can I enroll my child? Is there a specific procedure for children from abroad?

Deadlines vary according to school levels, places, etc. Families need to contact schools or educational facilities directly or check their websites for dates and application procedures. Usually the sooner the better (as of October for some schools, as of January for others), but even if a deadline has been missed, an application form could be processed if justified by context (family move for instance).

Whether or not your child will have to take an entrance exam / French level test or sit for an interview will depend entirely on the school he or she is applying to.
Note that the major international and bilingual schools are in high

## Whom should I contact?

## State-run French schools

Parents are usually required to send their child to the school nearest to their home. It is occasionally possible to apply for a place in a state-run school outside the family's chosen residential area (authorization must be obtained from the town hall or from the educational district's administrative head (Rectorat)).
For kindergarten and primary school, contact the school service at your local town council
For secondary school, contact the educational district's administrative head
To apply for an International Section, contact the school

## International private schools

In some of them, it is possible to enroll any time during the school year. These schools are full of expatriate pupils and try as much as possible to adapt to the special circumstances international parents are facing.
Note that most of these schools have waiting lists!
